## "Inside You" US Motown

Same album as the UK issue. Difference is a whole shot of Frankie's face on the cover, completely different to the UK picture, different label and three tracks missing: "Charisma"; "And I Will Love You" and "Walk On, Don't Look Back"

## "Close Up" Frankie Valli Private Stock

Frankie's first LP for Private Stock and the first indications of Frankies new direction in music began to show. Crewe/Gaudic were definately aiming for the disco market, especially with the funky soul cut of "Swearin' To God" - a boom for DJ's who need a rest!!

## "Who Loves You" Warner Brothers (Four Seasons)

A very good 'first' album from the new Four Seasons. Anybody who has seen them in concert (can there be anybody who hasn't?) will know that they are as good live, if not better, than when they are on record. Very tight production and superb musicians compliment the group throughout. Of the tracks, two have been chart singles "Who Loves You" and "Silver Star". Many people thought that taking two tracks from the album for singles was unwise - chart sales have proved otherwise. "Emily's Salle De Danse" is a superb track - over five minutes long. Value for money as always! The cover was changed from the original 'girl in blue' design because the album was originally to be called "Mystic Mr Sam"; but success of "Who Loves You" dictated a quick album re-design to cash in

## "Valli Gold" UK Private Stock

Although this is a good album for those people hearing Frankie for the first time, the compilation is a little disappointing, as it is all available on other albums. Best cut for me is "The Morning After Loving You" - a cool, mid tempo song - great! Worth buying just for the great cover design.

## "Our Day Will Come" US Private Stock

Now this is my kind of album. All new songs with Frankie in different moods. Disco - "Our Day Will Come"; Loving - "Carrie (I Would Marry You)"; Smoochy - "Closest Thing To Heaven". On this I'm personally torn between "Sweet Sensational Love" and "Closest Thing To Heaven". Quite a bonus on this album is two different shots of Frankie - one front, one back:

Already a disco classic and one record that will be played for many years to come.

# Frankie Valli with the classic Ourday, will come

Ft. Lauderdale, March 22. Franki Valli & the Four Seasons, Stewie Stone, Peter Graves Orch (11); three drink minimum.

Hitting South Florida with the nation's number one record didn't exactly hurt business when Franki Valli opened to booming S.R.O. business, but Valli always does well at Bobby Van's Sunrise Bívd. club.

With his cloud-high falsetto and rock era songbag intact, the singer of "Sherri" and "Big Girls Don't Cry" also serves as a straight man

for some breezy ribbing. But Valli is also a good musician and excellent showman.

Audiences like the little singer, even the youthful collega-typos who surged into Fort Lauderdale by the thousands two weeks before the usual Easter rush. When Valli introduced and sang his new chart buster, "My Eyes Adore You," youthful crowd seemed as pleased as the singer himself.

Comic Stewie Stone opens the show. He's a personable personification of an old guard standup who tells mother-in-law gags. —Hud.

A superb ballad of love from a distance. Beautiful and tearful lyrics. Frankie's voice has lots of emotion, a superb start to Frankie's new career with a great label. Fabulous! The flipside is an old ballad from the late 1960's.

"Swearin' To God" b/w"Why" Private Stock

Many D.J.'s were disappointed that they did not receive the special Private Stock release, "Swearin' To God" four minutes/ten and a half minutes. But, even the shortened commercially available cut is just right for disco play. So many people have crossed Frankie off the current trend list, but this single put him back where he belongs - with the latest music scene. The flip side is from the "Close Up" album.

F.Valli "My eyes adored you/Watch where you walk" USA Private Stock PS/PSR 45003. Released 10/74 Reached no. 1 on both Cash Box (entering chart on 9/11/75 and remaining 24 weeks) and Billboard charts (entered 23/11/75 and departed 23 weeks later). UK Pvt Stock PVT 1 Released 10/74 and reached no. 5 on

BBC charts (entering 1/2/75 and remaining 11 weeks).









F.Valli "Swearin' to God/Why" USA Private Stock PSR 45021. Released 4/75 reaching 6 on Billboard (entering 17/5/75 and staying 14 weeks) and no. 7 on Cash Box (entering 10/4/75 and staying 16 weeks in chart). UK Pvt Stock PVT 21 released 5/75 reaching no. 31 (entering 21/6/75 and left after 5 weeks).

F.Valli & the 4 Seasons "Touch the rain child/Poor fool" UK Mowest MW3028. Released 6/75 and non-charted.

[Interestingly, the DJ/promo copy had Touch the rain child 2:57 time/ditto 4:08 play length]

F.Valli "Our day will come/You can bet (I ain't goin' nowhere)" USA Pvt Stock 45043 released 10/75 entering Billboard charts 18/10/75, reaching no. 11 and staying 12 weeks) and reaching no. 14 on Cashbox (entering 18/10/75 and remaining 13 weeks). UK Pvt Stock PVT 42 released 10/75 but did not chart at all!

[Interestingly, the promo/DJ copy of Our Day Will Come had a short version mono 3:58/long version stereo 5:40 again PS/PSR 45043.

Also, an Educational Opportunities, US Coast Guard Academy record no. AAVP 74163 was released in 9/75 for use on USA radio only. Public Service Spots 1975/6. Valli speaks a 60 second slot on this 33½ rpm 7" disc]

4 Seasons "Who loves you/Who loves you(disco version)" USA Warner/Curb WBS 8122. Released 8/75. Peaked at no. 3 on Billboard (entered 23/8/75 and departed 20 weeks later) and no. 7 on Cash Box (entered 30/8/75 and remained in charts for 17 weeks). UK Warner Bros K16602. Released 9/75. Reached no. 6 in chart (entered 20/9/75 and exited 9 weeks later.

F. Valli & the 4 Seasons "December 1963/Slip away" USA Warner/Curb WBS 8203. Released 12/75. Reached no. 1 on both Billboard (entered 27/12/75 and remained in charts for 27 week) and Cash Box (entered 27/12/75 and left after 23 weeks). Issued in UK in 1976!
